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The section is responsible for improving forest stewardship programs conducted in the Region by planning and implementing research programs and working with operations personnel to apply technical information to solve problems and to pursue opportunities for improvement of forest stewardship

Purpose of Position and Summary of its Functions	This may be used for POSTING purposes.

The primary function of this position is to direct and conduct the regional research program in forest ecology. The position provides technical expertise on ecological interpretations and their applications and plans and conducts research in forest ecology. The position is also responsible for developing and implementing a proactive extension program.

Organizational Structure and Working Environment

The position functions as a research ecologist within the research group in the area of ecologically based forest management and collaborative research with stakeholders. This is one of eight specialist positions reporting to the Team Leader/Hydrologist who in turn reports to the Regional Staff Manager, Stewardship.

Position's Specific Functions and How They Are Performed

1. 35% Directs and conducts the regional research program in forest ecology by:

- Consulting with a variety of ministry staff and others on priority issues, interpretation and application of concepts and definitions
- Preparing research proposals and project plans for approval by the Forest Science Officer, Regional Manager and the Forest Science Advisory Group
- Leading project teams
- Engaging and providing technical direction to private consultant licensed professionals for research projects to augment in-house capabilities
- Designing and developing frameworks for information management and analysis of regional data
- Consulting with Regional, District, and industry staff to help resolve forest stewardship problems/conflicts
- Contributing to the setting of provincial standards for sampling, data collection and application
- Organizing and conducting meetings
- Developing strategies to resolve inter-agency and licensee differences
- Providing input into the analysis of regional and provincial data
- Preparing establishment, progress and final reports of findings and results
- Overseeing the management of the Regional Service Centre Herbarium

2. 30% Plans and conducts research in forest ecology by:

- Assessing available information and current research underway
- Carrying out exploratory research to clarify problems and issues and developing solutions
- Determining where new ministry research initiatives will have the most value and impact
- Preparing problem analyses
- Preparing research proposals and working plans
- Supervising and collecting data

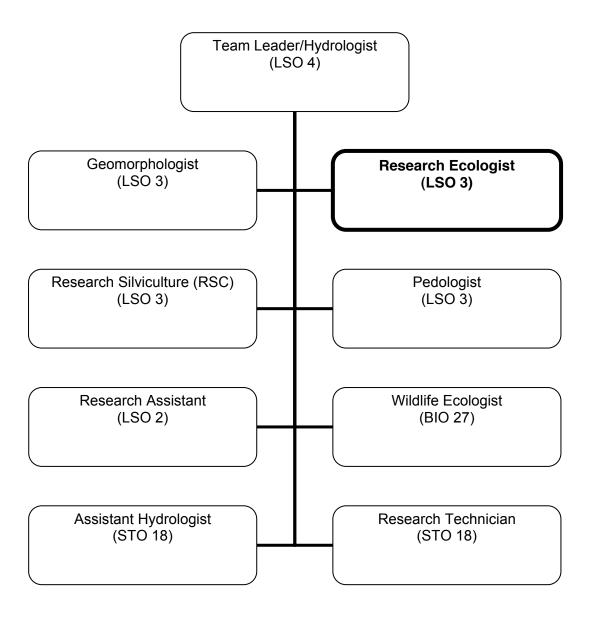
