To Minister Alty,

Re: Completing the Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission

The Professional Employees Association (PEA) represents over 4,000 members across 13 workplaces in British Columbia in the professional, education, legal, union and health care sectors. The professionals we represent are varied, and include foresters, lawyers, teachers, engineers, psychologists, pharmacists, veterinarians, librarians, and system administrators.

We are encouraged by your government's stated focus on advancing reconciliation and working in partnership with First Nations. The PEA stands ready to partner with and support the government in these efforts.

As we approach National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, the PEA urges the federal government to take concrete action toward reconciliation with Indigenous peoples. This year marked a decade since the Truth and Reconciliation Commission published its 94 calls to action. These calls to action acknowledge the cultural genocide, loss of life, and intergenerational trauma that First Nations, Métis, and Inuit communities continue to experience. To date, only 14 of the calls to action have been completed, 21 are stalled, while 14 have not been started. Of those that have not been completed, a large number require action by the federal government.

The PEA continues to support meaningful reconciliation by providing education to our members on the history of the Residential School System, acting in solidarity with the survivors, fighting for culturally appropriate policies that reflect the unique needs of Indigenous workers, and advocating for Indigenous rights. We call on the federal government to act with appropriate urgency to complete the remaining calls to action.
